Reflections from the Rectory

It has been said that times of change are the most stressful times in our lives. Moving house, changing jobs, getting married, children leaving home, and, on the whole, I absolutely agree with that. However, as the closure of St John's Church building in Newsome has been hanging over us all now for over 3 years the stress of what needed to be done has almost subsided. However, it returned this week when we were given notice that the building will close for public worship on Monday 6th March. This news comes with mixed feelings – there is a sadness to closing the building because the church has been central to community life in Newsome for many years. The building itself, which opened in 1872, is also an important part of the character of the village, but there is also relief that the work that needs to be done to keep it open will no longer be the responsibility of a handful of people who are the congregation. In the current financial crisis and with costs for everyday living increasing it was just too much to keep asking them to dig deeper and pay more for the upkeep of the building. However, the church, the body of Christ, lives on in a new place in the community. We are now worshipping with our brothers and sisters at Berry Brow Methodist church, and it is a great way of showing that Christians can and do work together very well. Our hope for the future is that we will be able to do more in the community as we work together to show people the love of Jesus through our actions.

The parish of Newsome and Armitage Bridge will still be here for everyone who needs us and the parish church, for baptisms, weddings and funerals will be St Paul's at Armitage Bridge. The church hall will be retained by the parish which means the nursery can continue to use it and the land the Scout Hut stands on will also stay with us, so nothing changes there either.

So, what about St John's Church building? What will happen to that now? Well, the hope is the local Green Party counsellors, Andrew Cooper, Karen Allison and Sue Lee-Richards will complete the purchase of the building soon after the official closure and work will begin to transform it into a community centre that will be accessible to everyone in the local area. The plan is to

have rooms for meetings, a coffee shop, a stage where concerts and performances can take place with space for an area where the church will be remembered with photographs and some of the existing furniture.

It will be great to see the now dark and dilapidating building transformed into a light, vibrant, living space where community groups can meet, and everyone will be welcome. It was what churches were built to be - a space where folk can come together and make new friends.

We can be confident that God has a plan for us as a church and for the building. We are told by the prophet Jeremiah that God says "For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. So, you see it's not up to us, it's all in God's plan.

So, in the sadness of the closure there is hope in the anticipation of what it will become and for that we need to give thanks to God and pray that the transformation will go well and be a place of community.

There will be a final service in St John's on Sunday 5th March at 3pm and everyone is invited. Please see the notice in this Focus magazine.

Here is some background about the situation in Nigeria, followed by prayers for each day of the week. Please use them this month, however God guides you:

'It looks like the life of common man does not matter in Nigeria...' Reverend Yanusa Nmadu, CEO of CSW-Nigeria.

We receive reports of attacks by armed groups in Nigeria's northern and central states on an almost daily basis. Similar incidents are now occurring in the south of the country.

Tens of thousands have been killed, and even more have been displaced, and there has been a marked rise in abductions for ransom.

During a visit to Nigeria in November 2022, CSW met with deeply traumatised people in southern Kaduna state. Some were victims themselves of abduction or attacks; some had lost loved ones; some had loved ones kidnapped, and were having to negotiate ransoms in daily calls from their ruthless captors.

Christians - and church leaders in particular - are primary targets for adoption and extortion.

Sunday: Pray Psalm 10.17,18 over Nigeria today, asking God for justice and righteousness to prevail in the nation: "O, lord, you will hear the desire of the meek; you will strengthen their heart, you will incline your ear to do justice for the orphan and the oppressed, so that those from earth may strike terror no more."

Monday: ask God to strengthen, bless and protect our colleagues at CSW-Nigeria today, including the state coordinators and volunteers. Ask him to give them wisdom as they continue to speak out for freedom of religion or belief for all, and bring hope to vulnerable communities and individuals.

Tuesday: pray for physical, mental and emotional healing, for former abductees across the country who were held in camps where arbitrary killings, assaults, rape and torture are rife. Pray for comfort for families whose loved ones were killed - often despite a ransom payment - and for deliverance for all still in captivity.

Wednesday: "The Lord is close to the broken-hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." (Psalm 34:18). Pray that this would be true for the communities in northern and central Nigeria who are hurting today.

Thursday: Leah Sharibu was abducted over five years ago from her school by IS-affiliated terrorists. The 19-year-old is still held captive, after refusing to renounce her Christian faith. Pray for renewed efforts to secure Leah's freedom, along with everyone else held by terrorists.

Friday: ask God to protect vulnerable communities who have been terrorised for decades by Boko Haram, and other extremists, and to disrupt every violent plan.

Saturday: Father God, deliver Nigeria from the hands of those who are set on violence. Released the captives, protect the vulnerable, raise up peacemakers, and stir the international community to respond, decisively to the many injustices, taking place in the country today. Amen.
