Saturday 10th Psalm 116, Song of Solomon 8.5-7, John 11.17-44

Wonderful God, we praise you for the way Christ's resurrection rekindles our faltering faith, gives light which breaks into our darkness, and touches us with the assurance that nothing will ever be the same again.

Sunday 11th April – Easter 2 – Acts 4: 32-35, 1 John 1:1 – 2:2 & John 20: 19-end Prayer for Today

Risen Christ, for whom no door is locked, no entrance barred: open the doors of our hearts, that we may seek the good of others and walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace, to the praise of God the Father.

Father, we praise you for the new life that Christ has made possible and for his coming to live in our hearts and lives.

Sunday 18th April – Easter 3 – Acts 3: 12-19, 1 John 3: 1-7 & 11-14 & Luke 24: 36b-48 Prayer for the Day

Risen Christ, you filled your disciples with boldness and fresh hope: strengthen us to proclaim your risen life and fill us with your peace, to the glory of God the Father.

Prayers for the Week

Monday 19th Psalm 96, Deuteronomy 5.1-22, Ephesians 1.1-14

Tuesday 20th Psalm 98, Deuteronomy 5.22-end Ephesians 1.15-end
